This painting by Gilbert Stuart (1755-1828), purchased through auction from the estate of Walter Jennings, Cold Spring Harbor, NY, is one of the University collection's most important works. The fulllength portrait of George Washington is of the Monro-Lenox type, so-called because the first painting in this pose was commissioned by Peter Jay Monro and later acquired by James Lenox, both of NY.

Baptized Hiram Ulysses Grant (1822-85) the 18th U.S. President (1869-77) was referred to as Ulysses by his family. Thus, in 1839, when he was preparing to enter West Point as a cadet, he reversed his initials to U.H. His name further changed and became established as U.S. Grant, when the Honorable Thomas Hamer, in soliciting his appointment from the Secretary of War to West Point, mistakenly put Simpson as his middle name. Upon his arrival at the military academy, he found himself registered with the initials U.S., an error which involved too much bureaucratic red tape to rectify. These drawings, part of the University large collection of U.S. Grant memorabilia, were probably done circa 1840 as academic exercises in an art class at West Point. They appear to be inspired by illustrations for Goethe's Faust depicting the Witches' Kitchen and Margarette's Room, done by Moritz Von Retzsch, a 19th C. German illustrator. Von Retzsch's line engravings of the same subjects are printed in an 1816 edition of Faust published in London.

Clark Mills was the sculptor of one of the earliest public art works to appear on Pennsylvania Ave., the bronze equestrian statue of Lieutenant General George Washington at Washington Circle. It was commissioned by Congress in 1853 and completed in 1860.

Thomas Sully (1783-1872) was an American painter and received his early artistic training in the miniaturist tradition from relatives. In 1801 he began his career as a portrait painter and in 1809 he went to London for a year of study with Benjamin West. On his return to Philadelphia, Sully rapidly became that city's most popular portraitist. In order to finance his trip to England, he did a series of subscription paintings for Benjamin Wilcox which were copies of known master works. This Mother and Child has been connected with Sully's name. Can you identify its historical precedent in a painting of the late Renaissance or possibly Mannerist period?

The Peale family of American artists (1760s-late 19th C.) practiced portrai miniature, history, still-life, landscape and animal painting. The first and most famous in the family was Charles Wilson Peale (1741-1827), who taught his brother James (1749-1831) and five of his own sons to paint. C.W. Peale's artist sons were Raphaell (1774-1825), Rembrandt (1778-1860), Rubens (1784-1865), Franklin (1795-1870) and Titian Ramsay (1799-1885). James Peale's son James (1789-1876) and his four daughters, Maria (1787-1866), Anna Claypoole (1791-1878), Margaretta Angelica (1795-1882) and Sarah Miriam (1800-1885), all painted still lifes as well as other subjects. The third generation of Peales included four more artists. University collection includes seven paintings done by members of the Peale family, among them Rembrandt Peale's porthole portrait of George Washington
